Nottingham City Advanced Designated Safeguarding Lead Fact Sheet 2024-2025

The Advanced Designated Safeguarding Lead role is to support school DSLs and includes:

- Act as a forum for communication and consultation between schools and the Safeguarding Partnership but also with other partnership bodies
- Provide an extended arm of front-line engagement with partnership activity through the Education Subgroup- Task and Finish activity will be led by ADSL where need identified
- Support the functioning of the DSL Network
- Develop and share evidence based good practice
- Support training and development through the Safeguarding in Education pathway
- Support the NCSCP and schools to undertake audit activity
- A range of other tasks for the NCSCP that strengthen safeguarding practices across the education directorate

*This will be a supportive role and will not include anything which undermines the clear leadership and governance of organisations.

The Offer: This is a significant CPD opportunity which will include learning mapped to relevant competencies.

For the individual:

- Induction and ongoing support
- Planned individualised learning and development opportunities
- Bespoke ADSL training (including train the trainers) and a wider offer of NCSCP training opportunities
- Regular ADSL meetings and wider networking opportunities within the education sector but other sectors also
- Potential to represent the sector in the work of safeguarding children at Nottingham City Council/NCSCP launch events/projects and initiatives
- Representative on the NCSCP subgroup and impact on delivery of safeguarding across the city

For the school:

- Funding to release staff (this will be paid at £350 per day to the host school for additional ADSL activity brokered through the Schools and Education Safeguarding Coordinator- minimum 4 days per academic year expected contribution
- Expectation that ADSLs will attend the DSL network as part of their school role
- Development opportunity to influence wider school systems and gain deeper safeguarding knowledge, material and contacts that the role offers

Eligibility Criteria:

- A minimum of two years' experience as a DSL
- Experience of middle or senior leadership role and able to demonstrate outstanding practice
- Evidence based commitment to excellence
- Effective experience in multiagency practice
- Understanding of how to implement safeguarding policy in order to ensure effective safeguarding outcomes/arrangements across the organisation
- A successful track record as an advocate to improve safeguarding practice at a strategic level and for individual children

Validation Process:

- 1. Application form with evidence from:
- 2. Validation discussion (approx. 1 hour)

- Inspection reports
- Direct feedback from colleagues and peers
- Performance management
- Endorsement by the head
